Background

In 1974, the United Nations and the Federal Government of Austria agreed to establish the European Centre for Social Welfare Policy and Research (European Centre) in Vienna. The 50th anniversary in 2024 marks an important milestone in a global context that calls for highlighting the need for sound social welfare systems based on sound social policy research.

The aim of this invitational conference is therefore to present and revisit the European Centre's activities based on a long-lasting partnership with various ministries in the countries represented in the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE). A key focus will be on the bridge building function of the European Centre between research and policy making, between the excluded and the included, between partners in the welfare mix; and between the EU and (potential) EU candidate countries (Western Balkans and Eastern Partnership).

We shall highlight the European Centre's contribution in building an evidence base for the improvement of policy delivery in the areas of health and care, social inclusion and protection as well as employment and labour mobility. We aim at raising awareness for social welfare in Europe, its recent history, its achievements, its challenges for the future and for ways and means to further improve social welfare policies and practices – in line with the United Nations' 2030 Agenda and the European Pillar of Social Rights.

This event shall also serve to honour the host country and all other countries and institutions that continue to promote the role and position of the European Centre.

The programme of the conference will serve to review major trends, achievements and shortcomings in social welfare in Europe over the past 50 years, to analyse the current situation regarding opportunities for bridging the gaps within and between societies, and to review the situation in selected member states by addressing issues at stake:

- What is the role of social policy in ongoing transformations and which kind of research is needed to promote social justice and security?
- What are the blind spots in the relationship between research and policymaking in the area of social policy, and how can related tensions be overcome?
- How can national interests be overcome in favour of international collaboration promoting sustainable and thriving societies?
